ESFA Council Report-July 2023

Council welcomed new member Ian Latta, representing the North, to his first meeting following his appointment at the AGM.

Council Members reflected on the AGM and agreed that a technological solution to voting in online meetings, given the relative complexity of voting rights, should be established before the November meeting of Council.

Council heard from the Captain of the U15 international girls' team who attended the meeting online. Ella commented on the quality of the trials process, including the venues and the quick decision making about selection. She reflected that the preparatory training camp was a good way for the players to get to know each other and to prepare for the Bob Docherty. Ella was clear about safeguarding arrangements and knew who to contact in the event of concerns, as the opening meeting had introduced the Team Welfare Officer. Ella felt that she and her team mates benefitted from good quality coaching and that she particularly liked the reflection and evaluation after each session, led by the Team Manager, which allowed players to be clear about what they could focus on to improve their game. Ella believed the best part of the international programme was working as a team and creating a special bond with fellow players, which has left her with fantastic new friendships. She also reflected that her time in schools' football had helped her to grow in confidence and to increase her skills. Ella challenged Council, when invited to comment on improvements she would like to see in the programme, to find a way to have a longer playing season with more fixtures, to which Council remain committed. The U18 Boys' Captain was not able to join Council but it is hoped that an interview with him can be recorded and published in the near future.

Council reflected further on the international programme and agreed to propose a rule change/special resolution to SAFIB to ensure that venue risk assessments for away fixtures were always shared with the opposition. The ESFA has the role of Vice Chair of SAFIB for 23/24 and expressions of interest for the role were invited from within Council. The incoming Chair proposed to Council that, for the furtherance of the international programme, it may need a Council Committee dedicated to the subject and asked for views. A separate Committee to consider District and County football would also be needed.

With regard to rep football, Council confirmed that play on a Sunday was acceptable, this was considered particularly helpful for the girls' programme where limits on playing opportunities had existed.

The calendar for 23/24 was updated in preparation for the publication of the 23/24 Handbook. Council thanked the outgoing Chair, Stuart Botham, for his service to the ESFA and wished the incoming Chair and Vice Chair, Marvin Robinson and Nick Loftus, every success for 23/24. The meeting closed with good wishes to all for the summer break.

ESFA National Finals

April, May and June 2023 saw the ESFA host 62 National Finals across representative and schools' football from the U11-U18 age groups. 15 National Inter District and Inter County Finals were hosted at Stoke City FC between 30th April and 13th May with the 10 U16-U18 Schools' Cup and ESFA Super League Finals also being hosted during this time. The PlayStation Schools' Cup celebrated its 10th anniversary with the finals once again being hosted at West Bromwich Albion FC from 22nd-25th May. 40 teams competed for the title of National Champions over the 4 days at WBA, with plenty of fun activities alongside the football, including the return of the PlayStation Schools' Cup FIFA championships. Special guests included England Lioness, Ella Toone, who was able to present medals to two mixed National Finalist squads, reminiscent of her own schools' football journey.

On Wednesday 14th June, the ESFA hosted the inaugural Pokémon Primary Schools' Cup Finals at Leicester City FC's King Power Stadium. The finals saw teams from all over the country compete to win in the U11 Schools' Cup, U11 Girls' Cup and U11 Small Schools' Cup competitions. The event, which saw a special guest appearance from Pikachu himself, was a landmark event for the ESFA's partnership with the Pokémon Company International and created a very memorable day for all players, teachers, spectators and supporters involved.

The ESFA went on to host the Champions' Cup plate finals at the Sixways Stadium, Worcester alongside 6 finals for the new Girls' Development competitions, which were launched earlier this year to expand the ESFA's girls' football offering.

Reward and Recognition

The ESFA was delighted to launch its inaugural Reward & Recognition Awards for the 2022/23 season, with 7 awards up for grabs for schools and Associations alike.

This new campaign saw the Association reach out to the army of volunteers that continue to dedicate their time to provide opportunities for school pupils across England to participate in local schools' football activity – whatever that may be. After consulting with Membership and the ESFA Council, the Association created four awards for Association Members and three for schools, to recognise the work carried out by individuals across the country and then to reward them for their continued efforts.

The number of nominations and votes that were received across the campaign were much higher than expected, showing that the R&R campaign is a well-received and necessary addition to the ESFA's calendar. Over 40,000 votes were registered across the categories, with the webpages receiving unprecedented levels of visitors.

Power up to play- The importance of a warmup

Power Up to Play is an initiative from the SKIPP charity, set up by medical professionals. Their aim is to improve young player welfare in grassroots sport through prevention of serious knee injuries.

Youth knee injuries requiring surgery have increased 29 fold in the last 20 years. 50% of these could be prevented by the regular use of a simple warm up programme. SKIPP are offering free courses to educate coaches on safety and prevention. Click <u>here</u> for more information.
